This week, the largest-ever New Nordic delegation to Singapore, consisting of 23 Swedes, 12 Finns, 11 Estonians, 3 Norwegians, 2 Lithuanians, and our two Danish Asia House colleagues, Honar and Peter, who proudly represented Denmark.



The delegation consisted of startups, VC investors, innovation hubs, and multiplier-organisations, with the massive SWITCH conference as the anchor event. Peter had the honour of having the first keynote at the opening event.

Here, Peter spoke on the importance of New Nordic collaboration when engaging with Asia, and presenting NAVA's showcase of Nordic innovations hub. In the meantime, Honar was exploring opportunities for educational collaboration. She met with partners from DS NORDEN and local universities, and representatives from the Ministry of Education. This was to groundwork future youth-related activities and delegations to Singapore, promoting Asia and the Maritime sector for future generations in Denmark.




Earlier this month, we also provided venue for the **Third Ayurveda Conference**, organized by the Danish Ayurveda Association and with support from the Embassy of India.

CBS Asia Days 2025 feat. Asia House




Asia House took part in CBS Asia

Sanae Takaichi appointed as Japan's 104th prime minister, making her the first woman ever to hold the position.

Often referred to as Japan's "Iron Lady" and known as a protégé of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, Takaichi secured a simple majority in both houses of parliament after her third attempt at the role.

She now faces the task of forming her new cabinet, which will be formally confirmed
