In September, <u>Asia House</u> and the EAC Foundation joined The <u>AVPN</u> Philanthropy Summit in Hong Kong, gathering changemakers from across Asia to explore how philanthropy can drive impact through innovation and collaboration. Represented by our CEO, <u>Dewi Dylander</u>, Head of Partnerships, <u>Torben Krab</u>, Senior Advisor, <u>Tom Sebastian</u>, and EAC Foundation Board Chairman, <u>Ove Ullerup</u> (*picture: right side*), we engaged with the Philanthropy Asia Alliance, Asia Philanthropy Circle, and other key partners.

The summit highlighted Asia's role as a global thought leader in philanthropy. Our <u>SPACES</u> initiative, together with <u>The EAC Foundation</u> and <u>Grundfos Foundation | PDJF</u>, offers Danish foundations a unique opportunity to join this dialogue. Building strong partnerships with Asia is crucial for Denmark's ambition to lead in the green transition.

In January 2026, SPACES will bring a Danish delegation to Singapore for a workshop with Asian peers, continuing cross-border collaboration and knowledge exchange.


## This Just in - Your Monthly Asia Insight

Vietnam celebrates 80 years since declaring independence with flags, boba tea and a military parade

At the beginning of September, Vietnam marked its 80th National Day with more than just flags and boba tea.

Crowds packed Hanoi's Ba Dinh Square, where Ho Chi Minh declared independence in 1945, for the country's largest military parade in decades.

The parade was joined by honor guards from China, Russia, Laos and Cambodia, which Vietnamese state media said reflected the country's "international friendships."
